### Headteacher's comments

Welcome back to the start of the new academic year. It has been a delight watching the children in Clover, Year One and Year Two settle so well into school after the long holidays. ### **Dates for the diary**

Please find attached a list of provisional dates for the academic year. We will send reminders about the events coming up but feel it is helpful to have the dates in advance. Please also remember that these dates are subject to change but we will try and keep to these dates as close as possible.

### Car Park

As a reminder, the school car park is only for staff and the parents of children who have the prior agreement with the school due to their child's needs. Those who have prior agreement should collect a badge from the school office to place on their dashboard.

#### **Maintenance**

Unfortunately over the summer we found a water leak which is currently being fixed in the car park. Therefore, please ensure you and your children stay clear of this area, which is coned off, until it is fixed. Thank you.

#### Playground

At drop off and collection, please ensure your children do not ride their scooters or bikes on school grounds and that they do not play with any of the school equipment. This is often set up for learning for the day and the climbing frames are only covered under insurance if a member of school staff is supervising.

#### **Attendance**

There have been changes to the attendance policy following government policy changes. The new policy will be ratified by governors at the next FGB and will then be circulated to parents. We have created a joint policy with Ely St Mary's to keep consistency between schools. Further information about the changes in the meantime are attached.

I would also like to remind you that classrooms open at 0845 and closes at 0855 when the register is taken. Any children arriving after 0855 will be marked as late. If your child arrives after 0920 they will be marked as an unauthorised absence unless there is a medical reason for the absence.



If your child is not attending school due to illness you must let the office know as soon as possible in the morning and by 0900 at the latest.
